

Glossary :

- **Out Growths (OG):** An Out Growth (OG) is a viable unit which clearly identifiable in terms of its boundaries and location contiguous to the town/city.

Examples are railway colony, university campus, port area, military camps, etc

- **Metropolitan (Million City)** Population of a city when exceeds 10,000,000 or 1 million (Census of India, 2011)

Example : Pune , Ahmedabad

- **Urban Agglomeration :** An urban agglomeration is a continuous urban spread constituting a town and its adjoining outgrowths (OGs), or two or more physically contiguous towns together with or without outgrowths of such towns. An Urban Agglomeration must consist of at least a statutory town(all places with a municipality, corporation, cantonment board or notified town area committee, etc.) and its total population (i.e. all the constituents put together) should not be less than 20,000 as per the previous Census.

Examples: Greater Mumbai UA, Delhi UA, etc.
